

Board of Control Meeting--February 19, 1944

The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the Phoenix Hotel, Lexington, Kentucky, on Saturday morning, February 19, 1944.

President Bridges called the meeting to order at 9:30, with all Board members present.

The minutes of the December 3-4, 1943 meeting were read and approved.

Principal Gordon Godbey of Lee County High School, Principal Lucian Burch of Owsley County High School, and Coach Graydon Frost of Owsley County High School appeared before the Board in an effort to settle the controversy concerning the alleged failure of the Lee County High School to submit on time to the Owsley County High School a preliminary tournament eligibility list. After the evidence was heard, the school officials were asked to withdraw. Robert M. Drennan moved, seconded by H. B. Gray, that the protest of the Owsley County school officials be disallowed since it could not be proved that Principal Godbey of Lee County High School failed to mail to Owsley County High School officials a preliminary eligibility list on or before February 1, 1944. The motion was carried unanimously.

Supt. Huey, Board Member Arrowood, and Mr. Sparks, father of Richard Sparks, all of Paintsville, appeared before the Board to request the reinstatement to eligibility of Richard Sparks. After hearing the evidence in the case, it was the opinion of the majority of the members of the Board that Mr. Sparks had established a legal residence in Paintsville. T. A. Sanford moved, seconded by Walter C. Jetton, that Richard Sparks be now declared eligible for athletic competition on the Paintsville High School team. All members of the Board voted "Aye" with the exception of Russell Williamson, who did not vote.

H. B. Gray moved, seconded by Robert M. Drennan, that all bills as recorded and read by the Secretary for the period beginning December 3, 1943 and ending February 18, 1944 be allowed. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Board of Control was then called to order in its capacity as the Board of Directors of the K. H. S. A. A. Protection Fund. H. B. Gray moved, seconded by

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
