

SECRETARY'S REPORT

To Members of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association for the Year 1928-29:

This year's membership is 456, which includes the following:-
71 new members and 385 old members, 41 of which paid the reinstatement fee of \$2.50; 17 members on last year's list failed to join this year.

Two schools applied for membership, but were rejected because they were not approved by the State Department of Education. One school on last year's membership list joined late and failed to include a sufficient amount to cover annual dues and reinstatement fee, after several attempts to collect the sufficient amount, we refunded its deposit.

The present districts seem in the main to be satisfactory, but there are probably one or two slight changes that will be made by the Board of Control for next year. From our office correspondence it would seem that our rules are now adequate, and I believe it would be unwise to make many changes at this meeting. The fact is that there have been so many changes made in the past two years that our members are not yet familiar with them. I believe it would be best to leave the rules as they are and give every one a chance to become acquainted with them. I hope, therefore, that but few changes will be suggested if any.

A growing number of our members believe that we should take some action on the report submitted last year by Miss Woerner's Committee on girls' basket ball rules. It is felt by many that Kentucky should

no longer be the only state which holds girls' tournaments played under boys' rules.

We have already received one membership for next year. I should like to urge all members to send their annual dues early in September. It will save a good many schools their reinstatement fee and will relieve the secretary's office of a lot of extra work.

We have had considerable difficulty this year in getting tournament and financial reports from tournament managers. In fact a number have not yet been received. I believe the Board of Control would be justified in refusing to allow a tournament to be held under the auspices of a school which has been remiss in this respect. In one tournament the financial management was entirely in the hands of a town committee and no one, not even the tournament manager himself or the principal of the school, knows any thing about the finances of that tournament. Certainly, no tournament should be held in that town again, even if the members vote to hold it there.

The Kentucky School for the Deaf is not eligible for membership under our rules, but has sought to be admitted for several years. It might be desirable to make a special exception in favor of that school, permitting them to join. Such an exception is made for similar schools in Illinois and Missouri.

It has been found that the second paragraph of Rule V of the By-Laws can not be applied to Kentucky Military Institute and Millersburg Military Institute. Either those schools will have to be exempted from the provisions of that paragraph, or else they will not be able to hold membership, in which case we probably ought to make an exception in their favor of Section I, Article 8 of the Constitution. During the present year the Board of Control waived the second paragraph of Rule V of the By-Laws for these two schools, as an emergency measure.

This year we purchased a mimeograph, which has more than paid for itself with money saved on printing and sale of lettergraph; we also saved about \$60 on postage by taking advantage of the new postal law under Section 435½ P.L. & R.
