K.H.S.A.A. Eligibility Appeals Committee Meeting

August 29, 1975

The K.H.S.A.A. Board of Control Appeals Committee met in Louisville, Kentucky, on August 29, 1975. Present were Chairman Frank Simpson, George Sauer, ARthur Hawkins and Denval Barriger. Also present were Assistant Commissioner Tom Mills and Commissioner J. B. Mansfield.

The following action was taken:

(1) The case of Mike Shirley was presented to the Committee by Prin. Ed Lowdenback and Assistant Superintendent George Hehr, Harrison County Schools. Mike was a first team player for Riverside Military Academy last year and is ineligible according to By-Law 6, Section 1. The Committee was requested to restore his eligibility at Harrison County

After discussing the case, George Sauer moved that the High School. Committee decline to restore Mike's eligibility. It was seconded by Arthur Hawkins and the vote was unanimous.

- (2) Prin. Louie Martin, Corbin High School, requested that the Commissioner bring the case of Jeff Carnes before the Committee. Jeff had played varsity football last season at Pulaski County High School in Tennessee. His parents have moved into the Grant County High School District. This school does not have football so Jeff wanted to live with a sister and attend Corbin High School and play football. Denval Barriger moved that Jeff's sister not be allowed to stand in place of his parents so as to satisfy the provisions of the Transfer Rule. The motion was seconded by Arthur Hawkins and the vote was unanimous.
- (3) Prin. Winston Adkins, Johns Creek High School, petitioned the Committee to restore Kenneth Stiltner's eligibility. He is ineligible because of his age, being born on August 31, 1956. The Committee denied the request with the opinion that if one exception was made there would be no stopping place. There have never been any waivers of the Age Rule. The action was taken on a motion by George Sauer, seconded by Arthur Hawkins, and a unanimous vote.
- (4) Denval Barriger moved and Arthur Hawkins seconded a motion to waive the portion of By-Law 29, Requirements for Coaches, in Jefferson County Schools as it applies to assistant coaches and coaches of minor sports temporarily as it applies to being a member of their regular high school faculties. The motion carried unanimously.
