FROM THE COMMISSIONER'S DESK



Happy New Year to you! The KHSAA staff is looking forward to seeing your voting delegates and other guests at the upcoming Annual Meeting and Delegate Assembly on January 13, 2005. The Annual Meeting is always a great gathering and gives each of us the opportunity to review and discuss the

proposed changes to the Association Bylaws that are put into place by you and the rest of the membership. In addition, it is our hope that the Annual Meeting workshops are interesting to you and thought provoking. It is our intent to bring you up to date on current issues, provide an update on rule interpretations, and review Association operations through the 2003-04 "Annual Report".

As we reflect on the Annual meeting and the KHSAA mission, we are reminded that good sportsmanship is at the core of what interscholastic sports are all about. It is everyone's responsibility to embrace this value. KHSAA Bylaw 11 states "It is the clear obligation of principals, coaches, faculty members, boards of education, and all official representatives of member schools to practice the highest principles of sportsmanship and the ethics of competition in all interscholastic relationships with fans, officials, players, coaches, official representatives of member schools, and the general public.

As we continue into the winter sports season in Basketball, Swimming and Wrestling, we need to reinforce to our coaches, student athletes, and fans that poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. The National Federation sports playing rules address unsportsmanlike conduct. KHSAA Bylaws 11 and 33 also address the penalties that can be administered for unsportsmanlike conduct such as fighting and flagrant acts. Additionally, you are reminded that providing a safe environment for competition is one of the responsibilities of school personnel when hosting events. Adequate security at contests is a must and policies regarding this important contest management responsibility should be addressed.

SANCTIONS FOR CONTESTS WITH OUT-OF-STATE TEAMS

When Kentucky member schools are participating in contests involving out of state teams, the host school from that state is responsible for completing the sanction form through the applicable state association. However, each Kentucky school participating must verify with either the KHSAA or the inviting school that a sanction has been approved. A Kentucky school may not participate in an event out of state for which sanctioning is required but has not been completed. A complete review of the sanctioning requirement is contained in Case Situations BL23-1 and BL23-2 on page 32 of the 2004-2005 Handbook.

KHSAA member schools hosting an event, that require an NFHS sanction, are to complete the NFHS sanction form and include a processing fee in the amount of \$75.00. The fee should be made payable to the National Federation **and sent to the KHSAA** with the appropriate form. The KHSAA is responsible for forwarding the form and fee to the National Federation Office.

A sanction form is not required if all participating schools are from bordering states of Kentucky. **Please note**, however, that Tennessee, Virginia and West Virginia require a sanction form for every out-of-state tournament. KHSAA BYLAW 27 CLARIFICATION

Bylaw 27 Section 3 (b) "Requirement For Coaches" states that "any person assigned to coaching duties at any level (grades 9-12) shall be duly employed through the respective board of education, and the entire coaching salary shall be paid through such board in accordance with local Board of Education Policy."

Bylaw 27 specifically addresses Level 1 and Level 2 coaches. The bylaw is interpreted to mean that Level 1 and Level 2 coaches must be designated, appointed, approved, or hired within the published policies of the Local Board of Education. Coaching salaries (including whether or not coaches are paid) are the jurisdiction of the Board of Education through the budgeting process. There may be some cases where Level 1 or 2 coaches are appointed at no salary. This is permissible as long as they have been duly designated through the policies of the local school and/or Board of Education.

The KHSAA has no jurisdiction as to whether or not "volunteers" (persons who are neither Level 1 nor Level 2)

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are used within the athletic program. Local Board of Education policies should address persons that do not meet the requirements of a Level 1 or 2 coach, and the terms and conditions of their designation in accordance applicable state law. Allowable duties for those individuals are restricted by Case BL-27-4.

The deadline for boys' and girls' basketball team photos and identifications is Mon., Feb. 7.

Failure to submit the photos **WILL** result in a fine assessed to the school as permitted by KHSAA Bylaw 33.

The photo MUST BE AN ORIGINAL. Faxed copies, copies of photos, newspaper copies, or laser printer printouts **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE**.

You may go to the "Members Only" page on the KHSAA website and use the "Upload Photo" feature.

If the photo is available digitally, please email that copy to <u>mmitchell@khsaa.org</u> rather than sending a printout. The photo must have been scanned at a minimum DPI of 300 and is not bitmapped. The file should be sent as an attachment and saved with a file extension of .jpg, .gif. or .tif.
