Perform the same calculation for male participants. For example, if there are a total of 300 female participants, and 180 girls are on varsity teams, 80 girls on junior varsity teams, and 40 girls on freshman teams, then $60 \%$ of girls' participation opportunities are at the varsity level ( 180 divided by 300 ), $27 \%$ are at the junior varsity level ( 80 divided by 300 ), and $13 \%$ are at the freshman level ( 40 divided by 300 ).
