Cheerleaders at Boyle County High School are selected by KAPOS judges from outside the school system. The judges rank the students with the top sixteen named to the black squad and the next sixteen (or less) named to the gold squad.

The black squad cheers for all football games and girls soccer. The gold squad cheers selected football games and all boys soccer games. During basketball season, the black squad does half boys and half girls, alternating with the gold squad.

GIRLS AND BOYS BASKETBALL GAMES SCHEDULING

The girls basketball team plays its games on Mondays and Thursdays. For scheduled boy/girl doubleheader we use the following format: if the doubleheader is scheduled on Monday or Thursday, the boys play first and the girls second; if the doubleheader is Tuesday or Friday, the girls play first and the boys second. This year during district tournament the boys played first, the girls second; next year we will reverse the order of play.
