4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first comperitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are giris. In order to determine the total number of athletics participants an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include ciub or intramural sports participants or cheerleaders). Calculate the same way for boys and giris.
5) Calculate the percentage of female participation (column 1) based on information from (column 4).

Calculate the percentage of male enrollment (column 1) based on information from (column 4).

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in column 5 is within $3 \%$ of column 3 then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

2) Determine the total number of participants for boys and girls at each competitive level. ( $42,6,9$ )
3) Calculate the percentage of female and male participants at each level. (3, 6, 9) Example: Take the total number of female participants from the Summary Program Chart 1 (form T-1) and divide it into the number of total participants for each level, varsity, junior varsity and freshman levels. Perform the same calculation for male participants. For example, if there are a total of 300 female participants, and 180 girls are on varsity teams, 80 girls on junior varsity teams, and 40 girls on freshman teams, then $60 \%$ of girls' participation opportunities are at the varsity level ( 180 divided by 300 ), $27 \%$ are at the junior varsity level ( 80 divided by 300 ), and $13 \%$ are at the freshman level ( 40 divided by 300 ). If there are a total of 400 male participants, and 250 participate at the varsity level, 100 boys participate on junior varsity teams, and 50 boys participate on freshman teams, then $63 \%$ of boys participate at the varsity level ( 250 divided by 400 ), $25 \%$ compete at the funior varsity level ( 100 divided by 400 ), and $13 \%$ compete at the freshman level ( 50 divided by 400 ).
