#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Title IX—Gender Equity Committee for the 2000-2001 school year, is the SBDM Council at Pike County Central High School. The SBDM Council is the chief administrative and governing body for all extra curricular and co-curricular activities and has oversight of the athletic programs and cheerleading programs that are addressed in the Title IX Final Audit Report for the 1999-2000 school year.

The Title IX coordinator for Pike County Central High School is Valerie Slater, Guidance Counselor, for the 2001-2002 school year and selected by the SBDM Council on March 08, 2001.

#### 2000-2001 ANNUAL REPORT AND CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN

#### 1. Item #3-Interest in Girls's Soccer, Swimming, Diving, and Tennis

The survey indicated that there was some interests in girls' soccer, swimming, diving, and tennis. Do the that fact that we do not have the facilities at Pike Central for soccer, swimming, and diving and because very few schools in our immediate area, if any, have these sports, it would be very prohibitive at the present time to add these sports. We do have one tennis court on site, however, we do not presently have anyone on staff who have the credentials or qualifications to possibly coach tennis and there are very few teams in the region have who have a tennis program, if any. In addition, at the present time there are no positions created by the Pike County Board of for these sports and the local boards of education are the only administrative governing body that can create positions and authorize payment for coaches.

Also, these are sports that we do have an interest to add to our sports programs when facilities and other teams in the region are established. At the present time we are studying the feasibility of beginning a girls track team, if there is sufficient interest by female students. The SBDM Council has already discussed and approved this issue.

#### 2. Item #7--Softball facility on Campus

A softball facility on Campus is a major concern for this Gender Equity Committee and this SBDM Council. We presently do not have the land needed to have a softball field on campus. We are in the process of trying to acquire land from the Kentucky Highway Department and to request the land to be filled when US 119 is constructed. We have contacted Paul Patton, the Governor of the State of Kentucky, the Kentucky Highway Department, the Pike County Board of education, and several state legislators in hopes of securing this land and the fill for a softball field on the campus of Pike Central. We will be meeting with the Kentucky Highway Department in the Spring in hopes of securing this needed additional land. A copy of the letter of request to the Frank Welch, Superintendent and the Pike County Board of Education is hereto attached.

All coaches have their own offices with telephones. Our facilities are among the best in the State of Kentucky.

We are requesting that Superintendent Welch and the Pike County Board of Education, by letter, assist us with completing storage facilities and assisting with securing locker rooms and restroom facilities for the softball team at Mullins Elementary School, a copy of this request is hereto included in this report.

The SBDM Council and Title IX—Gender Equity Committee are very supportive and very committed to trying to secure as fine of facilities as we can possibly have for our softball program. We continue to strive to improve the opportunities for the students in the softball program.

#### 3. KHSAA Follow-Up

#### A. Selection of Cheerleaders

Pike County Central High School selects the boys and girls varsity cheerleaders in two different auditions. The cheerleaders are allowed to try out for whichever squad that they choose. We personally believe that the cheerleaders are of equal quality. Matter of fact, in the eight years that we have been at Pike County Central High School, our boys and girls varsity squads have won the region, each, five times and have advanced to the state cheerleader competitions five times. In addition, this year both squads had two seniors each. In addition, most of the years, in the eight years that we have been at Pike Central, there have been more cheerleaders on the girls' squad than the boys' squad. In addition, the SBDM Council addressed this

issue and established a policy that each squad could have the maximum amount of cheerleaders that KAPOS would allow to cheer and compete at KAPOS sanctioned cheerleading competitions, plus one. However, we will begin having boys and girls varsity cheerleaders begin cheering for some boys and girls games.

#### B. Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball

We have examined the number of prime time games for both girls and boys basketball. The boys basketball team has a higher percentage of games during prime time than the girls basketball team and this has been the case for the last two seasons. During the 2000-2001 basketball season we have immediately began trying to remedy this situation by playing some of the girls and boys varsity basketball games on the same night. Beginning this upcoming school year we will begin, as contracts are renewed, scheduling boys' and girls' basketball games on the same nights, during prime time and during the week. We will begin scheduling our district games, as soon as possible adjusting for an equality between the girls and boys varsity basketball prime.

#### 4. Title IX School Coordinator

There was a discussion concerning the Title IX Coordinator for Pike County Central High School, for the 2001-2002 school year. After the discussion there was consultation on whom to select for the Title IX Coordinator. After the consultation, Roger Johnson, Principal of Pike County Central High School recommended Valerie Slater for the position of Title IX Coordinator.

#### SELF AUDIT—2000-2001 KHSAA TITLE IX ATHLETICS AUDIT

As evidenced in the self-study there was a need identified for a locked storage area for volleyball. We have identified an area that could be used for this need. We have requested from the maintenance department of the Pike County Board of Education the fabricating of a caged area that is lockable and secure. This would only require one wire-caged wall being constructed. We have other additional storage areas for volleyball, but this request would facilitate an additional storage area that would be secure and lockable. The maintenance request form is hereto included in this report.


