The following forms were omitted and must be submitted by school representatives: C. Other Recommendation and Comments: D. All calculations appear correct and the report appears to be in good order. The data indicates that the school is currently meeting the standards established in Test # 1 and Test # 2 for Opportunities. The information provided indicates a fairly large discrepancy in per athlete spending between males (\$482.00 per athlete) and females (\$346.00 per athlete). This situation should be closely monitored by the school administration as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee.
