Far from the truth is that little attention is being focused on the Title IX deficiency of prime time games for our girls basketball team. I believed we were making positive progress in this area having eight of twenty-three games scheduled on the prime nights for the 2003-04 season but that was before I learned that in order to count toward Title IX compliance, prime time contests must be home games.

I have met with our Title IX committee, site based council and have informed our boys and girls coaches of our situation and will attempt to correct by next season, 2004-05. Our plan is to begin with our contacts for scheduling games for next year immediately after the Christmas break. Girls will be given the first priority of scheduling with the exception of boy's dates already under contract.

I thank you for your assistance and information in this matter and look forward to speaking with you again.

Based on an onsite Audit Review in the 2002-03 school year, KHSAA Audit Staff members requested information regarding the intent to be taken by Raceland High School to rectify the limited number of "prime time" playing opportunities afforded the girl's basketball team. lifomationfecemedfrom Raceland High School did not adequately, address the specific stent that was to be undertaken. In fact, a review of your 2003 -04 girls basketball schedule indicates just the opposite......the girl's "prime time" eppotulities diminished from $29 \%$ in 2002-03 to $18 \%$ in $2003-04$. During the $2003-04$ basketball season your boy's teams "prime time" playing opportunities exist at $50^{\circ} \%$ Obviouslydittle if any, attention has been focused on this. Title lx deficiency.

You are directed to provide to the KMSAA, no later that h December 1, 2003, written documentation regarding Raceland Eight School plans to ensure that no less than $40 \%$ of gills basketball games for the 2004405 season will be played during "prime time" opportunities. "Prime time" is defined as play on Friday and/or Saturday. Anything less than 40\% "prime time" play in 2004-05 for girl's basketball will necessitate a review of the reduction or elimination of boy's basketball games played in "prime time.

Hopefully, other than our need to monitor this progress, you will ensure that further corrective action by the KHSAA will not be necessary and that Raceland High School girl's basketball players receive the same benefits Raceland High School's boy's basketball team members receive. *Documentation to explain the $\$ 1,200$ difference in spending for boys' and girls' equipment:

We make an attempt to alternate the purchasing of uniforms and major equipment. Last year boys basketball uniforms were purchased and the girls have ordered new uniforms for next.
*Zeros in columns, especially the ones in regard to travel:
Our board of education pays for the transportation for our teams. Expenses often incurred are lodging and meals and in the areas where zeros are shown there were no additional expenses beyond the transportation.

There was no expenditures in boys cross country for awards and equipment
*Difference in boys and girls track awards:
Our boy's track team won the class A state championship. The boys, community and parents presented the boys rings for their effort provided by fundraisers.
*The difference in coaching salaries for like sports:
Coaches are paid a base salary and are award a $2 \%$ increment for each year of service. See enclosed pay schedule.

## *Difference in boys and girls awards:

The difference in monies spent for boys and girls is found in my previous statement regarding our boys being awarded state track championship rings.

*The zeros in baseball, tennis and volleyball travel:
No expenses incurred by these teams. Our board of education provided the transportation.
*Lack of coaching salaries in tennis:
Both boys and girls tennis coaches receive $\$ 812$ each.
*The difference in awards for boys and girls:
This is an area that will be researched by the Title IX committee and be included in our corrective action plan. In the past, we have allowed our coaches to award their athletes at their discretion. We will attempt to provide a more equitable manner in which our athletes are awarded.

## Response to Item \#8, KHSAA Recommended Action

## (Prime Time Contest/Girls Basketball

The RWHS girl's basketball coach has been given the prionity of scheduling prime time games for the upcoming season. She finds it difficult to schedule any more prime time games than listed on last year's schedule. This is one area that we find ourselves at the mercy of our opponents and their ability to schedule. This will be a continued effort and I believe, in time, we will be able to schedule a sufficient number of games during prime time. This may be one area that may take some time to get our scheduled aligned.

## (Coaching)

The base salary of common coaches, boys \& girl's basketball, boys \& girl's track, etc., is the same. The difference in salaries comes with time in service in that particular sport. Coaches are given a $2 \%$ increase for every year of service served in that sport in addition to the base salary.

## (Locker Room, Practice and Competitive Facilities)

In the very near future we plan to move into a new gymnasium and athletic complex. Plans have been made to provide for locker facilities, medical and training facilities. As far as the playing area of the softball field, we have hosted the regional tournament on our field and we received positive reviews of our facility. I have included pictures of our outfield area and fail to see the problem with a low place in center and right field. Please see the attached pictures of our field looking from home plate to right center field and from the right field foul line to center field.

Not having a press box is a definite problem and it is an item included in our district wide facility improvement plan. During big games or tournament play an area in the stands, behind home plate, is roped off for scorekeepers and public address announcer. At the present time, the only alternative is not to use the press box at the baseball field.

## (Medical and Training Facilities)

There is no discrepancy in who pays for physical examinations. The school has arranged with the local outreach health centers for physical examinations at a school discount rate with the student being responsible for his/her physical examination. RWHS has a contract through the Ashland Physical Therapy that provides:

Athletic trainer at games
Walk-in clinics on an as needed basis for both on and off-season activities
Consultation with local orthopedist for more serious injuries
Off-season training programs for interested athletes
Fitness club memberships

A schedule for weight room use has been established and posted on the door. Coaches will schedule through the athletic director for opportunities to use on an equal basis.
