Based on the information provided in this Annual Report, \$602 is spent per individual male athlete and \$423 is spent per individual female athlete. This appears to be a very large disparity in terms of the amount of money expended for males as compared to females.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

Note: If the percentage of current participants added in the last five years is 25% or greater, compliance with test two may be possible. If less than 25%, then compliance with test three should be analyzed. <u>CAUTION</u>: 25% is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard.
