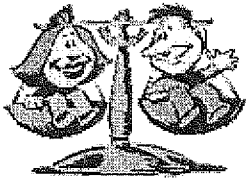

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. In the spring of 2003, maintenance crews discovered the football stadium had shifted off its concrete base. After inspections by engineers, geological personnel and an architect, it was determined the stadium should be condemned. The board of education approved the construction of a new stadium, and the project was completed in the fall and winter of the 03-04 school year. This was an unforeseen and unplanned expense; thus, the Title IX report reflects a much larger amount of money is being spent on boys' sports than on girls' sports. Without this unforeseen expenditure, the expenses for boys and girls would have balanced out a little more equally.

The Webster County Board of Education provides financial support for competition transportation. That allotment is enough to allow all teams to travel to the contests in which they participate. No team is denied trips because of lack of funding.
