- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. - Each varsity player receives a letter and a bar, JV gets a JV bar, and freshmen receive numerals.
- Swimming, golf, and tennis (girls and boys transportation) provided by their parents.
- Travel for football includes two buses. Beechwood Board of Education policy requires chartered buses for trips over 100 miles
- This year the Beechwood Athletic Department paid for the Athletic Trainer from St. Elizabeth Medical Center of \$8500.00.
- Coaches' salaries are attached. Salaries are based on the number of year's experience.
- See attachments for expenditures, which includes All KHSAA playoffs and State Tournaments and games.
- Beechwood paid \$65,000.00 for the track to be re-surfaced. (Beechwood only has girls track)

Due to lack of participation Beechwood had to cancel varsity fast pitch softball and JV slow pitch softball, freshman and (1) of our junior high girls basketball teams, but we did add frosh swimming and Girls Indoor track.

Cheerleaders were not used in any of our calculations. They are selected for varsity, JV, and freshman football and basketball games. They cheer football in the fall, and equal number of girls and boys home basketball games during winter.
