Other Recommendation and Comments: According to the data submitted, the school appears to currently be meeting the standards established in Test # 1 and Test # 3 for Athletic Participation Opportunities. A major concern is the disproportionate amount of expenditures on boys' athletic teams in relation to girls' teams. According to the expenditure figures submitted, school personnel are spending \$240.83 per male athlete and \$93.41 per female athlete. This spending pattern should be closely monitored by school administrators as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee. Next year's report should show movement toward parity in this area.
