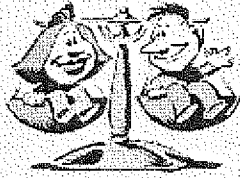

Program expenditures

The reason the girls' expenditures is more than the boys is due to monies spent on a new softball field (\$22,000) and girls' basketball team played in a Holiday tournament in Florida. The girls spent about \$5,000 more than the boys on travel/food expense for that reason.

The girls' coaching salaries for basketball is more than the boy's salary due to the girls' basketball coach being a certified teacher in a higher pay scale, and the boy's being a classified person.

Normally the two basketball programs expenditures are fairly equal.
