The school is strongly urged to add students to The Gender Equity Committee. A significant number of students expressed interest in swimming (92) for girls (34) for boys, and tennis (68) for girls (31) for boys. According to your report

as members on the report. The school is strongly urged to add students to The Gender Equity Committee. A significant number of students expressed interest in swimming (92) for girls (34) for boys, and tennis (68) for girls (31) for boys. According to your report neither of these sports are offered at your school and you must report this interest on form T-3 as well as investigate the interest by meeting with students and parents. The addition of a sport would enable the school to be in compliance with one of the three tests. Presently the school is not in compliance with any of the three tests. This matter should be addressed by the Gender Equity Committee and the school administration. The percentage of students returning the survey was 69%. The school needs to develop a method that will yield a higher percentage. Presently, the boys have an advantage in opportunities offered to participate.
