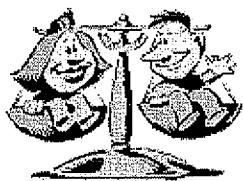

D.	X	<p>Other Recommendation and Comments:</p> <p>...highly recommend that the Gender Equity Committee meeting be held at least once during each of the sports seasons (fall, winter, spring). Budget Concerns (T-35 and T-36) Constant concern must be given to the budget...without football the girls are outspending the boys...when football is added in, the budget shows 66% of the allocations to the boys program. Since 39% of the participation is female a close eye needs to be given to assure that football spending does not turn this into a red flag issue, currently who are spending \$499 per male athlete compared to \$408 per female athlete and this puts East Ridge very close to non-compliance in this area. (1) Concern and possible red flag issue the \$1,414 more for Boys Basketball compared to Girls Basketball. (2) Concern and very much a red flag concern is zero dollars spent on travel in Boys Baseball (3) Concern with awards expenditures in only three sports. ATHLETIC SURVEY'S - Left the "How was the Survey Administered? (Line Blank) Survey indicates interest in these sports that East Ridge does not offer: Girls and Boys Soccer, Girls and Boys Swimming, Boys Wrestling, Girls and Boys Tennis. Your report shows corrective action in regard to Girls Soccer, but fails to address any corrective action in regard to other areas of interest shown by students on the survey. Gender Equity Committee needs to meet and put together a plan to determine if these interests are real and if so to provide corrective action plans to address these interests. These plans and/or corrective action plans are to be submitted to the KHSAA by June 15, 2006.</p>
