

 - Boys Basketball, Girls Softball, and Football numbers merit same consideration for a new team, committee wanted the surveys to be re-counted to make sure the following students information would not be counted:
 - a. over age students
 - b. students who were graduating
 - c. students who were transferring
 - d. only 8th graders for football who would be Freshmen next year

III. Possible Corrective Action Plan was discussed.

- All of the coaches' surveys were discussed and none of the concerns were decided to be Title Nine violations.
- Student surveys were to be re-counted as mentioned, and teams would be considered if numbers merited consideration to start a new team; also in the Fall after school begins another could be made to determine interest for softball and baseball (football would be too late, re-count indicated no new teams should be added).

- Committee wanted the Girls Basketball Coach to survey the girls basketball team to see interest as prime time play. (See attached)
- Girls Basketball will play ½ games early time and ½ late with the boys team
