According to data and responses submitted, the school is currently meeting the standard established in all three tests for provision of athletic opportunities. Data submitted in relation to athletic expenditures indicates that the school is currently spending approximately \$1,284 per male athlete as compared to approximately \$961 per female athlete for provision of athletic benefits.  These spending amounts tend to indicate disparity in provision of benefits and should be monitored closely by school officials as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee during the next school year. Also, the school's Corrective Action Plan needs to be more specific and show activities for improvement and a time table for correction.
