- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. TITLE IX 2006-2007 NOTES

- (1) The board paid for one bus for each team to each away event. Football had to pay for 2 buses over the one that the board provided.
- (2) During the 2005-2006 school year, the booster club spent \$20,000 on the weight room for equipment. I multiplied the \$20,000 times 46.3% for the girls amount and 53.7% for the boys amount. Girls equals \$9,260. Boys equals \$10,740. Then I divided those amounts by the number of teams for boys and girls. Each girls team equals 578.75 which would round up to 600. Each boys team equals 596.66 which would round up to 600.
- (3) During the 2005-2006 school year, the Board of Education spent \$45,000 on weight room equipment. Following the same procedure as in (2). Each boys team equals 1,342.5 which would round down to 1,300. Each girls team equals 1302.1 which would round down to 1300.
- (4) During the 2005-2006 school year, the Board of Education contracted a new gymnasium to be built and the old one renovated. The combined cost for those two projects was 1,750,000. The boys and girls basketball teams, volleyball, and wrestling use those facilities. So each of those teams would have 437,500 listed for their share of the facilities improvements.
