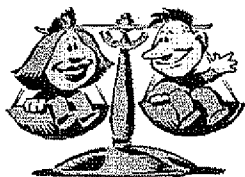

We had 6 JV soccer games scheduled this year but all of those matches were cancelled for various reasons; weather, sickness, the other didn't have enough to play a jv-varsity DH, etc.

As a result we lost the option to double count the girls that would have played in those matches which accounts for a large majority of the drop in the number count for the girls. As we talked about on the phone, the boys also had a large drop in number count.
