The meeting was opened at 5:38 pm.

Items for discussion: 1) KHSAA forms, 2) KSD Coaches Equity Survey 3) Review last years Corrective Action Plan 4) Review KHSAA Survey a) Discuss Football-fall season, b)Discuss swimming- Winter season.

- KHSAA forms. Smiley will work on completing forms. It is a long process and he has done this for many years. Mr. Smiley made the motion that he will complete the forms. It was seconded by Kevin Hamilton. Motion Passed.
- 2. Scott reported he had talked with all the other coaches except for Lisa Kingsley and the coaches did not have any complaints about inequity except for the boys basketball team did not get sweatshirt hoodies last season the same as the girls team. Some discussion took place. Lori Mohan moved to accept Scott Johnson's report it was seconded by Lisa Kingsley. Motion passed.
- 3. Last season's correction action plan. Two items were brought up for corrective action. 1) Girls motivational tee-shirts/hoodies. Completed April 30, 2006. 2) Schedule girls and boys equal primetime games. Completed May 1st, 2006.

It was moved by Scott Johnson to accept the report of last season's corrective action plan. Seconded by Kevin Hamilton. Motion passed.

4. KHSAA Survey required by the KHSAA.

Discussion about the possibility of starting up football again at KSD too place. Mr. Smiley shared information about the start up cost which would be \$13,450.00. There are some questions to be asked of the KHSAA 1) How many players to start up and 11 man team. 2) How many players to start an 8 man team. There had been no response at the time of the meeting.

Mr. Smiley is going to ask an impartial staff person to talk with each of the 18 boys interested in playing football to make sure all 18 are truly interested.

There was a pro and con discussion held.

Pros: Students want football, Bringing back a KSD tradition, Maybe football will attract new students to KSD, Good experience, after football players are in better shape for basketball, Football could be a carrot for the boys and girls if interested to keep up good behavior and grades. More alumni will show up for fall homecoming. The boys enjoy playing football more, The boys are willing to play no matter win or loose.

Cons: Many weekends away from family, High risk of injury, Will we have enough students to carry football on year after year, If injury occurs will boy be able to play basketball, Day students can they participate, Very expensive, On Monday and Tuesday will school suffer because boys complain of hurting and not being to participate in school, Age maybe boys will not be able to play all four years of high school, Will coach complain about loosing, Lack of football experience and conditioning.

A motion was made by Lisa Kingsley that the school have a Plan A 11 man football Plan B 8 man football, Plan C flag football. The motion was seconded by Kevin Hamilton. Discussion about flag football and would there be competition? Kevin Hamilton has done some research and says that competition would be available through possibly recreation dept and other schools and some schools for the deaf.

Drew Meade addressed some of the cost issues by saying parents could be responsible for buying shoes and mouth guards.

Lori Mohan asked how many deaf schools still had football and it was answered several of the Mason Dixon schools still play along with Ohio and Indiana.

The question was called for and the motion passed.

Winter season- Girls and Boys basketball of course stay. According to survey there is interest there. Mr. Smiley recommended bring back the individual sport of swimming. Scott Johnson made a motion to bring back swimming, Lori Mohan seconded, motion passed.

Spring sports. 13 boys said they were interested in baseball. Six were interested in track. Bobby Reeves commented that not many boys knew the rules to baseball. It was decided not to pursue baseball.

5. This year's corrective action plan. A motion was made to have the boys basketball team get sweat shirt hoodies. The motion failed. Mr. Smiley suggested that from now on every sport get some kind of tee-shirt every year. It was made into a motion and it passed. Scott Johnson made a motion that a basketball white board be put into the boys locker room similar to the one in the girl's locker room. Lori Mohan seconded. Motion Passed.

Recently I attended a KHSAA Title Nine Conference and as a result, you can see the attached KHSAA guidelines and also the *revised* Kentucky Classic Game Schedule.

In Kentucky, "prime time" is games that are played on Fridays and Saturdays. The rule is for at least 40% of the games must be the girls' team receiving the prime time to play the game. Both Friday and Saturday nights, the boys will play first and the girls will play second. On Saturday afternoon and on KSD Homecoming, the girls will play first and boys will play second, which results in both teams receiving 50% of the "prime time" slots.

Girls' Basketball "Prime Date/Prime Time"


The Kentucky High School Athletic Association Board of Control, at its January 2006 meeting, established a membership-wide policy with regard to future activities regarding girl's high school basketball and its relationship to achieving Title IX and Gender Equity compliance.

The KHSAA policy is as follows:

Each year, beginning in school year 2006-07, girl's basketball teams must schedule at least 40 percent of their regular season home basketball contests on prime dates (Friday night, Saturday or Sunday). This girl's percentage must be accomplished irrespective of the boy's home game "prime date" percentages. If schools schedule boy/girl "prime date" double-headers, then girl's basketball starting game times must be the second scheduled game of the double-header as follows:

One Double-Header (Optional As To Which Team Plays Second) Two Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Once) Three Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Once) Four Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Twice) Five Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Twice) (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Three Times) Six Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Three Times) Seven Double-Headers Eight Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Four Times) Nine Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Four Times) Ten Double-Headers (Girls Game Must Be Second At Least Five Times)
