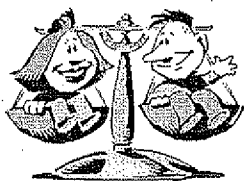

The guideline used by KHSAA auditors for schools with football is a \$100 difference to allow for the greater expense of football equipment. It is recommended that the Gender Equity Review Committee and appropriate school personnel review expenditures over the past three years and submit an explanation by July 1, 2007.</p> <p>Regarding Form T-60, Corrective Action Plan, Item I lists improvements in equipment provisions for both track teams and in weight-training machines to be used by all athletes. Form T-41 lists an advantage to boys' teams in the Equipment and Supplies area. Please provide more information as to how these actions will provide more equitable benefit to girls. 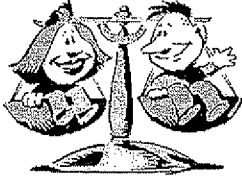

In regard to form T60 the Corrective Action Plan states that a new high jump mat will be purchased. This purchase will benefit both the girl's and boy's track team

The purchase of the universal weight machines that were placed in the weight room helped to provide a more equitable weight room. These machines can be adjusted to use less weight for the girl's than the free weights that we used to have.

The purchase of additional strengthening/ endurance equipment will be placed in the girl's locker room in the gym. This equipment can be used by the Girl's Basketball Team, Softball Team, Track Team and the Volleyball Team. All girls' team has access to the weight room but the addition of more strengthening equipment to the girl's locker room will provide benefits to our girl's programs.

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In regard to form T41 an advantage was given to the Boy's Program in Equipment and Supplies due to the fact of more spending. The Girl's Programs spent \$8,194.00 on Equipment and Supplies while The Boy's Programs spent \$47,382.00. Below is a breakdown on spending of each program in Equipment and Supplies.

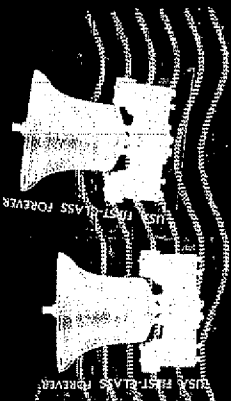

To: Title IX Review Committee:

This letter is in regard to the discrepancy in total spending between boys and girls sports at Leslie County High School. The Title IX audit committee stated that the Gender Equity Review Committee and appropriate school personnel review expenditures over the past three years and submit an explanation. Our committee members met on June 11, 2007.

One issue that was reviewed was the turn over of coaches in the past three years. In the past three years we have hired new softball, volleyball, girl's basketball and boy's basketball coaches. Of these positions the boy's basketball coach and the booster club has had numerous successful fundraisers. On the other hand, our softball, volleyball and girl's basketball coaches are not motivated fundraisers or have had successful booster clubs. They most rely on private donations, admission fees and concessions to fund their programs. This is what the committee determined to be a cause in the discrepancy of expenditures.

Our committee has come to the consensus that our boys' basketball, baseball and football programs have some areas of spending that can be cut. We also came to the conclusion that our girls' programs can become more active in fundraising and form more organized booster clubs.

We believe if we work together we can erase the discrepancy that has occurred the past two years.
