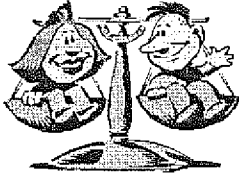


Dear Assistant Commissioner Boucher:
