#### ATTACHMENT FOR BUDGET

All funds for extracurricular activities are provided by the St. Patrick Activities Club (S.P.A.C.).

#### \*EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

Medical supplies, water bottles/coolers, towels and other nonsports specific supplies are purchased at the first of the school year and are replaced as needed. All athletic teams have access to these supplies.

The baseball and softball teams purchased new uniforms. We had 19 on the baseball team and 14 on the softball team. The players and coaches chose the uniforms. The baseball uniforms cost \$90 each and the softball uniforms cost \$60 each. Based on future participation, we purchased 25 baseball uniforms and 18 softball uniforms. Baseball coaches are required to wear the uniform and softball coaches are not required.

The cross-country teams purchased new uniforms. The cost per uniform was the same for both teams.

The soccer teams purchased new uniforms. The cost per uniform was the same for both teams.

We did not have any girls to participate on the swim team. The boys purchased new uniforms.

#### \*\*Travel

All of the athletic teams, with the exception of the golf, swim and tennis teams travel by school bus. This is funded by S.P.A.C. There is no set budget for the athletic teams. The expenditures shown are for the bus drivers.

The golf, swim and tennis teams travel by cars and/or personal vans driven by coaches and parents. They are offered a reimbursement of \$.30 per mile. This is funded by S.P.A.C.

A parent with a CDL volunteered his services for some of the trips. Most of his trips were for girl's basketball, softball and volleyball.

#### \*\*\*Awards

Each athlete receives a chevron letter with the sport emblem for his or her first year on a varsity team. After receiving a letter, each athlete receives a chevron bar with the sport

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emblem for each year they compete on the varsity award. The same guidelines also apply to those on a freshman team.

All senior athletes receive a plaque listing their accomplishments.

#### \*\*\*\*Coaches Salaries

One person serves as coach for both boys' and girls' teams for cross country, swim and tennis. We did not have any girls interested in participating on the swim team. The swim coach receives \$500 whether there are one or two teams.

The girl's soccer team had 2 volunteer assistant coaches that were part time. The boy's team had 1 volunteer assistant.

#### \*\*\*\*\*Facilities Improvements

The baseball team uses the field at the Tom Browning Boys and Girls Club. The amount listed is for the rental of the field. The softball team uses a public park.

The boy's and girl's soccer teams both use the fields at the Tom Browning Boys and Girls Club. The amounts listed are for the rental of the fields.

#### \*\*\*\*\*Publications

The sophomore class has an activities program that is a money making project. It includes pictures of all extracurricular activity teams. It is given out at all home basketball games.
