On last year's survey we had 2 girls sports and 1 boys sport with possibilities as discussed in Fall 08 audit.

Girls

Tennis-We do not have tennis courts at our school. Only 1 or 2 in whole area. Swimming- We do not have a pool at our school.

Although there was a sizable interest we do not have the facilities for either sport.

Boys-Wrestling

We have explored this possibility for a couple of years. However, we have found no one with wrestling experience to coach or even one willing to learn with whom we were comfortable with to start the program. We will continue to look for wrestling coach.

In addition, we will resurvey kids to determine which kids are really interested and which kids just signed up.

- 1. We have printed schedule cards at no expense with Football on one side and Volleyball on the other, received late. Same for Boys and Girls Basketball.
- 2. We have a football program. It is run through the Belfry Boosters and proceeds are used for all sports.
- 3. One coach does both boys and girls track.
- 4. Volleyball travel was less as coach was driver and donated trips.
- 5. Football team had higher travel expense due to paying for band and cheerleader buses, and taking 3 buses to varsity games.
- 6. Boys expenses higher due to football: more numbers, higher cost of equipment, salaries(more asst coaches), etc.
- 7. Girls basketball coaching salaries less than boys due to both coaches being 1st thru 3rd year teachers. Minimal difference.
- 8. Boys basketball team purchased new uniforms for 06-07 and expenses were higher. Girls purchased new uniforms for 07-08.
- Softball travel was less as driver donated trips.
- 10. Golf coach retired. Had no one to coach golf this year. Unable to field B/G team. Expenses from 07-08.
- 11. At present, the BOE has no allotment for coaching salaries for B/G soccer. Has been discussed, but no action taken. Our principal will bring up again this spring.
