- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.)
Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

The following reflects the "Prime Time/Prime Night" Home scheduling of the Butler Traditional High School Girls and Boys Varsity Basketball Schedule for the 2008-2009 season.

The Girls Varsity Basketball team played nine home basketball games for the 2008-2009 season. The Boys Varsity Basketball team played eight home basketball games for the 2008-2009 season.

The breakdown of the nine girls games are as follows:

The girls had nine home games and five were played on Prime Nights; 55%.

Four were played on nights which the Boys Varsity also played a home game. Of the four games played the same nights as the boys, two were held on Fridays (Prime Night) and two were held on Tuesdays. Of the two Friday dates, the girls played at the "Prime Time" 7:30 one night and the boys played at 7:30 the other night.

Of the five remaining nights, which the Girls Varsity played at home, three were played on a Tuesday; one was on a Wednesday, and one was on a Friday. Of these five games, all five were played during the Prime Time slot.

Every effort has been made to adhere to the Prime Time/Prime Night directive issued in 1972 to scheduling home basketball games at the high school level.



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The following guidelines were used for the selection of the cheerleading squads at Butler Traditional High School.

2008-2009 School Year:

A team of KAPOS and Cheer sponsors were the judges. They watched a try-out routine by each participant, and selected the teams. The try-outs were held after a two-day cheerleading clinic at which time each participant was coached in the elements of cheerleading.

The Varsity Squad will be divided into two squads; a Red and a White Squad. Each will cheer selected

home and away Varsity and JV Football games.

The Varsity Squad will also be responsible for cheering at all home and away Varsity Boys and Girls Basketball games. Alternating the home and away and the gender of the games cheered by the two squads accomplished a balance. No one squad will be responsible for cheering just for boys and girls.
