Awards Policy:

All sports should have some type of awards/recognition ceremony at the conclusion of their season. This is to recognize the student athletes that represented our school. Each coach can pick the awards they will present with the understanding that cost should be held to \$12-\$15 per award item.

The coach may determine to have a meal at the banquet, desert only, pot luck etc. This will be up to individual coaches.

Awards for some sports come from conference affiliation. Example is the WKC banquet in December that recognizes football players that make the All WKC team. The school will pay for the attendance of these players for this recognition. This is true of any sport that has a conference recognition event.

Travel/ Per Diem Allowances

At Caldwell County High School the school board pays for fuel for the transportation of athletes. Many sports have drivers that will volunteer to drive teams at no cost. Some of our coaches have CDL's and drive their own teams. In the event that a driver is provided on a non voluntary basis the cost is taken out of the sports budget. Overnight trips the sport is responsible for meals and lodging of the driver.

Summer trips will be taken out of the budget of the sport for travel since the school board does not pay for summer trips.
