Х	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data, calculations; and responses submitted, the school is likely meeting the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The school currently offers all KHSAA sanctioned sports for girls at the varsity level as well as 17 total team opportunities for both boys and girls. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be outside acceptable parameters (approximately \$1,223 per male athlete and approximately \$845 per female athlete). This spending should be closely monitored so the disparity does not continue over a two-year period. Oversight in this area should also be a part of the school's Corrective Action Plan.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1/Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

Note: If the percentage of current participants added in the last five years is 25% or greater, compliance with Test Two may be possible. If less than 25%, then compliance with Test Three should be analyzed. <u>CAUTION:</u> 25% is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard.
