3. Fast Pitch Softball increase travel was for out of state trip to Alabama for tournament.
4. \$65,574.00 was spent on moving baseball field from off campus to new field on high school campus. The cost included new backstop, new outfield fence, new sod infield, new pitching mound, new PA system, and new batting cage.
5. Increase in football spending due to field improvements for practice and game field in fall and spring. Cost includes seeding, straw, aerating, fertilizing, weed control, labor, and equipment rental.
