E.	Х	Other Recommendation and Comments: All calculations appear to be correct, and the report is in good order. According to data and responses submitted, the school is currently meeting the standard established in Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. The most recent student athletic interest survey appears to support the responses given on Test 3. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is still outside acceptable parameters (approximately \$640 per male athlete and approximately \$480 per female athlete). The school's Corrective Action Plan indicates that this area has been targeted over the past two years, and this work has reduced the difference. The monitoring of this spending should continue until the difference is within acceptable standards.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
