The Gender Equity Committee needs to look at the coaching situations in Boys and Girls Basketball where both have 3 teams yet the Girls have less coaches. This is potentially a Red Flag Issue that you need to discuss and document in the minutes of your committee. An attachment may be needed to explain this potential issue. The same situation is present in Baseball/Softball but the number of participants has been documented as the reasoning for this potential Red Flag issue. The Gender Equity Committee needs to keep an eye on the situation and document all discussions and actions taken.

Title IX Meeting Minutes:

- February scheduling and athletic sign up does not look promising for female participation. The girls that did sign up put down for sports played at the same time. Example volleyball and soccer. Although enrollment is up for this coming year participation is low. Possible reasons were given: feeder programs are not strong athletically because of inner city situation, those that come to Holy Cross from outside feeder schools are coming for academics, art or music.
 - Districts went well with only a few exceptions. Boy/Girl double headers were a hit with all Athletic Directors except for two. Many people commented positively on atmosphere and increased attendance for girl's games.
 - Senior night had to be moved because of Denim and Diamonds. Will have it as a boy/girl double header next year.
 - Fast pitch has enough for two teams this year. Discussion about getting more freshmen involved to play fastpitch. Many girls who play volleyball and soccer at Holy Cross play club ball. It would be nice to curb the practice time to get 8 more players to join other freshmen to have a freshman fastpitch team.
 - Local Boy's club has advised that they need to shut down pool during the winter months. This causes great alarm for our swimming program. Anne Julian is involved in working with Covington Latin and Holmes to see what monies are available to help with cost to keep the pool open.


