- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.

Coaches would deposit money from fundraising events into their school account and would use this money to buy necessary equipment, supplies, food, awards, etc.

Girls and Boys Basketball differences:

in SCHOOL VS BOOSTER EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURES

- Boy's basketball ran the majority of their money through the school account instead of their booster account.
- Girl's basketball runs the majority of their money through their booster account.

In TRAVEL:

Girl's team traveled to Louisville for Holiday Tournament. Boosters paid for bus, hotel and meals. Boy's stayed at home.

Softball and Baseball differences:

in SCHOOL VS BOOSTER EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURES

- Baseball uses the school account when purchasing balls, bats, hats, etc instead of using their booster account
- Softball uses both the school and booster account when purchasing the same type of equipment as baseball.
 in TRAVEL.
- Softball team traveled to Cocoa Beach, FL during Spring Break
- Our baseball coach prefers not to travel to FL. He stays around the area to play games during our Spring Break. in FACILITIES IMPROVMENTS:
- Baseball complex was completely destroyed in the 2005 tornado and we are still having difficulty with our infield. Last season, we spend money on drainage issues, dirt and improvements on the grass infield.
- Softball field is in good shape and no field work was needed.

in PUBLICATIONS:

Baseball boosters do a Spring Sports Program for all Spring Sports (baseball, softball, track and tennis).

Girls Golf and Boys Golf differences:

In SCHOOL VS BOOSTER EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURES:

- Girl's golf uses the school account when purchasing equipment.
- Boy's golf uses both school and boosters account. Boy's golf boosters purchased shirts for each player.

In SCHOOL VS BOOSTER TRAVEL:

- Girl's golf had an individual that qualified for the state tournament.
- Boy's golf boosters paid for several meals for the boys on the day of their matches.

In AWARDS:

• Boys had more members on the team and had a nice meal at their banquet.

Girls and Boys Soccer differences:

In SCHOOL VS BOOSER EQUIPMENT EXPENDITURES:

- Girl's Coach wanted a different style of uniform so the boosters paid the differences in the price of the uniforms. In SCHOOL TRAVEL:
- Girl's transportation to away games was a drop off only (bus took them to the games and then returned back to Hopkins
 County). The girls rode home with their parents after the game.
- Boy's had to keep the bus at the games. We had several boys whose parents did not attend the away games.
- Boy's booster club paid to feed the boys prior to their away games. Girl's booster parents donated the food to feed the
 girls prior to their away games.

Football Expenditures

Football coach brought most equipment through the school account instead of the booster account.
