Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

- 1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
- 2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4.
