NOTES:

- 1. Archery Team: The school formed an intramural/club Archery Team during the 2007-08 school year. During the 2008-09 school year, this program involved a total of 49 students (34-males, 15 females). These students participated in archery from the first of November through the middle of March. They practiced two days per week, competed against themselves, other area schools as well as hosted the regional archery competition and attended the state archery tournament.
- 2. Soccer: In evaluating the student surveys completed during the 2007-08 school year, the school's Title IX committee felt their was still not sufficient interest in forming a sustainable soccer program. With limited developmental programs in the area the committee felt that starting a program was questionable at this time. However, at the urging of the KHSAA, the committee completed follow-up meetings during March 2009. In evaluating these follow-up meetings, the committee has decided to recommend to the Superintendent and Board of Education that they consider the implementation of a soccer program in the Logan County Schools phasing in the program over a 4-5 year period.

Should the Superintendent and Board of Education accept the committee's recommendation; the school's athletic director will pursue creation of this program during the summer of 2009 and the 2009-10 school year.

- 3. Wrestling: In evaluating the student surveys completed during the 2007-08 school year, the school's Title IX committee felt their was not sufficient interest in forming a wrestling program. The committee felt that the student body as a whole did not understand what high school wrestling involved and though wrestling meant what they watched on television. However, at the urging of the KHSAA, the committee completed follow-up meetings during March 2009. In evaluating these follow-up meetings, the committee still felt that there was still limited interest in wrestling. Additionally the committee had the following concerns:
 - Lack of Knowledge on what High School Wrestling Involves.
 - Lack of Available Coaches in Area
 - Proximity to opponents (Closest is over 45 miles away)
 - Current Economic Conditions

However, the committee did note that there are 12-15 students who attended both the in-school and evening meetings regarding wrestling. The vast majority of these students are not currently involved in any extracurricular program. The committee felt that the school should explore the possibility of adding wrestling as an intramural sport to further gauge interest/knowledge of wrestling and to educate others on wrestling. But the committee felt that several hurdles needed to be crossed prior to even an intramural program being established. They include:

- Locating knowledgeable adults to supervise/coach the program.
- Location of a used wrestling mat to be used in the program.

 The committee felt that the cost of a new mat should not be undertaken at this time until a definite interest exists and can support the expenditure of such an amount.

If approval is given to this recommendation, the school's Athletic Department will pursue these issues during the summer of 2009 and the 2009-10 school year.

Athletic Department

Logan County High School

The 2007-08 school year had Logan County High School begin utilizing an approximately 35,000 sq. ft. Academic-Athletic Facility built as an addition onto our present building. Total project cost was \$4,865,814.13. Approximately 65% of the building is used primarily for athletics and physical education.

This facility consists of the following:

- 4,400 sq. ft. weight room / fitness center. This facility is separated by a half/half glass and concrete wall.
- Multi-Purpose Room: Used for Cheerleader Practice, Aerobics, and other Fitness Classes/Activities.
- Football Locker Room w/storage area.
- Coaches Office/Video Room
- Aux. Gym with seating for approximately 450 spectators. Included in this facility are two locker rooms with 60 lockers each. Also has storage for Volleyball and school's physical education classes.
- Entrance/Lobby w/public restrooms.
- 2—Classrooms
- 1—Alternative Learning Center (ALC)
- The School District's Alternative School

In discussions with Commissioner DeVries in November of 2008, she advised that in reporting of this addition, the school should just attach an addendum to the 135 & T36 forms of the school's Title IX report providing summary of monies spent on this project and what facilities are included
