E.		<ol> <li>Other Recommendation and Comments:         <ol> <li>The Gender Equity Committee needs to keep an eye on the student interest survey, especially in regard to volleyball. You have addressed the issue well in your report but keep looking at it so it does not become a red flag issue.</li> <li>The Gender Equity Committee needs to take a serious look at the overall expenditures between boys and girls athletics. The report is misleading to the outsider as the \$75,000.00 total added in for improvements to the softball field, make it appear that the girls spending are in line with the boys. With the figures given in this report the school is spending \$694.53 per male athlete compared to \$370.81 per-female athlete when you sit aside the improvements to the softball complex. This is a difference of \$323.72. When you are a football playing school these figures will never be equal but when the difference in spending per-male athletes compared to per-female athlete is more than \$100.00 a potential red flag goes up. This is even harder to explain when the T-1 report indicates that 48% of the students participating are females. Areas to look at are:</li> </ol></li></ol>

- In the area of Equipment and Supplies \$39,928.00 was spent for boys athletics while \$16,025.00 was spent on female athletics. This is potentially a red flag issue.
- In the area of Travel \$11,744.00 was spent on boys athletics while \$6,299.00 was spent for female athletics. This is potentially a red flag issue
- In the area of Awards \$580.00 were spent on boys athletics white \$360.00 was spent for female athletics. This is potentially a red flag issue.
- In several areas the coaching salaries are different in like sports. A copy
  of the Pineville Coaching Stipends should be sent to the KHSAA so it
  can be placed in the schools Title IX File.
- If changes need to be made in any of the areas listed above it should be reflected in a corrective action plan and all of this should be documented in the minutes of the Gender Equity Committee. Minutes of the Gender Equity Committee meetings should be sent in with the yearly report and placed in the KHSAA Title IX file for your school.
