E.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data and calculations submitted, the school is likely meeting the standard established in Test 1 for provision of athletic opportunities. In relation to Test 3, it is suggested that the school pursue the indicated interest in freshman girls softball. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to currently be outside acceptable parameters (approximately \$638 per male athlete and approximately \$449 per female athlete). Athletic spending was also slightly outside the established standard on the 2008 annual report. Spending imbalances which extend over a two-year period are very significant and should be addressed with strict monitoring. Oversight of this spending should be part of the school's Corrective Action Plan until the imbalance is eliminated.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
