The student interest survey does show a significant interest in girls swimming, but this is probably not a feasible option for the school at this time due to the lack of a facility and the small number of schools offering this sport in the geographic area. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending seems to be within acceptable parameters on a per athlete basis.
