



- Girls and Boys Basketball:
 - Same total amounts are given to boys and girls teams
 - \$4,000.00 per head coach
 - \$2,600.00 per JV coach
 - \$1,200.00 per freshman coach
 - Total of \$7,800.00 for both boys' and girls' teams coaching stipends / salaries
 - For the 2008-2009 year the head girls' coach wished to have another assistant at \$100.00. Henceforth his salary shows \$3,900.00 while the boys' coach is shown at \$4,000.00.
 - The board granted his request, to give \$100.00 of his salary to pay for the additional assistant
- Boys' Baseball & Girls' Softball
 - \$1,800.00 is allotted to the boys' and girls' teams by the Board of Education
 - The softball head coach allots his as follows: \$950.00 + \$425.00 + \$425.00 = \$1,800.00
 - The baseball coach allots his as follows: \$1,200.00 + \$200.00 + 200.00 + \$100.00 + \$100.00 = \$1,800.00
