This report needs to be in by September 1, 2010.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The T-35 and T-36 report indicate that no school money was spent for travel for Cross Country, Golf, Swimming, Baseball, Softball or Tennis. In comparing the past three years a big difference appears in Travel Spending. No one travels for free in today's world and the correct figures are not being reflected in this report. The Gender Equity Committee needs to take a look at the T-35 and T-36 report and re-submit it to the KHSAA by September 1, 2010.
