Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. #### Plans to Address Interest:

Our Student Interest Survey results for 2009-2010 indicated that Girls Swimming is the highest total for a KHSAA sanctioned sport which we do not offer, but this number is down by more than 30% from two years ago. We still believe the interest would drop dramatically when the participants learned the full circumstances. There are no pools, public or private within a 20 mile radius that could serve our school. Travel, time restraints, and student unawareness of the training time for a swim team make this unrealistic.
