E.	X	<p>Other Recommendation and Comments: According to data and responses submitted, the school is meeting the standard established in Tests 1 and 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. In order to continue to meet the standard established in Test 3, the school should address the marginal interest indicated in such sports as girl's soccer, girls tennis, and girls golf and determine the validity of expressed interest. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is slightly outside of acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis. The addendum attached to the report seems to provide a reasonable explanation for the short term disparity. Athletic spending should be monitored in the future for equitable provision of benefits.</p>
