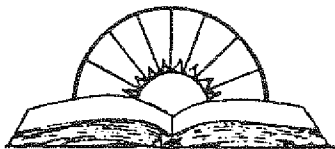

Enclosed please find the Title IX report for Graves County High School. As you will notice, we are making a conscious effort to improve the quality of our facilities and expand opportunities in all of our sports. Figures noted in this report reflect several improvements, especially in areas outside of football and boys basketball. In meeting a recommendation on the 2009-09 Title IX status report, our expenditures per participating girl are \$869.58 compared to \$777.93 expenditures per participating boy.

As indicated in our last report, we completed renovations to the girls' basketball locker room. As planned, we added new bleachers at the softball field, along with a new tarp and backstop. The boys and girls soccer teams have a new pavilion, with the investment also including a new fence and concrete work. Upgrades to the surface of the tennis courts in the last year benefit both boys and girls tennis programs and have allowed for an increase in participants.

We have also made several advances in our coaching staffs. The coach of the boys and girls swim team is now a certified staff member, and an assistant tennis coach has been added to help facilitate the growth of our tennis program. A third volleyball coach has been added with the start of our freshmen and middle school programs. Softball has added an additional coach bringing their total number of coaches to four.

Also as planned, funding began in the fall of 2009 for a middle school volleyball program. While these expenses are not reflected in this report, we are encouraged that this expanded opportunity will continue to build our volleyball participation and promote the long-term health of our female athletics program. The volleyball booster club started in the spring of 2009 continues to advocate for the advancement of the volleyball program.

In the summer of 2010, for the first time, volleyball participants will have their own locker room. Future plans include adding an additional volleyball coach as the program grows. During the 2011 season, the tennis program will offer JV tennis and also provide opportunity to middle schoolers.

We are working to develop long-range plans for all of our sports, to maintain equality on fundraising opportunities, and to continue to exercise fiscal responsibility in building on our quality programs. Graves County High School and our athletic department are committed to enhancing our excellent facilities and coaching staffs, while offering our student athletes every possible opportunity to excel in sports at the high school level.
