E.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to responses submitted by the school, it is meeting the standard in Test 3 for provision of athletic opportunities. The information on the most recent student athletic interest survey does not seem to support the responses on the T-3 form because of the indicated interest in girls soccer (47). The school needs to validate this interest in order to meet the standard established in Test 3. School officials are reminded that the most serious Title IX deficiency is the failure to provide equitable opportunities. Each school should meet the standard of at least one of the three opportunities tests during each school year. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis.

1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team.
