Expenditures: Ohio County High School has monitored budget allocations in an effort to close the gap between gender expenditures. The total spending for the 2008-2009 school year indicate that 56% of total expenditures was spent on male sports while 44% of the total expenditures was spent on female sports. The monitoring of the budget has closed the gap by nearly 7% from the 2007-2008 school year in which 59.4% of total expenditures was spent on sports for males and 40.4% of total expenditures was spent on sports for females. 
