E.	X	Other Recommendation and Comments: Calculations and data submitted by the school indicate that the standards established in Tests 1 and 2 are not being met. The responses on the T-3 form indicate that the standard established in Test 3 is being met, however, the information in the most recent student athletic interest survey does not seem to support the responses on the T-3 form. The survey shows interest in girls cross country (20) and girls soccer (75). In order to meet the standard established in Test 3, these interests should be pursued for validity. School officials are cautioned that the most serious Title IX deficiency is the failure to provide equitable opportunities. The school should meet the standard of at least one of the three opportunities tests during each school year. School officials and the Gender Equity Review Committee need to address the equitable provision of athletic opportunities. The steps taken to provide these opportunities should be documented in the school's Corrective Action Plan (T-60). In the area of benefits, total athletic spending appears to be within acceptable parameters on both a percentage and per athlete basis.
