The information contained in the most recent student athletic interest survey appears to support the responses on the T-3 form. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is currently outside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on both a percentage and per-athlete basis. This disparity appears to be explained and justified in the current corrective action plan.

Ms. Sallee: You will find enclosed a copy of our Title IX Survey form T-63 which deals with the student questionnaire. Mr. Gary Lawson requested that I initiate this survey this year and next year to bring my 2009-2010 report into compliance. I administered the questionnaire on Sept. 8, 2010 for this year. When it came time to fill out and submit my Title IX report for Community Christian Academy high school, those sections of the on line reporting process were gray and indicated that no action was to be taken.
