E.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments: The data, calculations, and responses submitted indicate that the standard established in test #3 for provision of athletic opportunities is currently being met. The school currently offers 17 total team opportunities for female athletes as compared to 19 team opportunities for male athletes. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is barely within acceptable parameters on a per-athlete basis and is slightly outside those parameters on a percentage basis. This situation appears to be addressed in the current corrective action plan. Thanks for a good report.
