While students were in a bonus period they were provided access to the online survey site SURVEY MONKEY. The KHSAA student interest survey had been uploaded to this website for student participation. This is our high school's first year of a 1:1 laptop initiative. Using this method to survey our students was both a way to insure a more accurate reflection of our students' interests as well as the use of our wireless/laptop capabilities. What was surprising was the fact that our students in grades 9-11 did not have the desired participation rate of 80% completing the survey. This is further indication of a growing level of indifference among students that is reflected in the growing challenge faced with getting students to participate in athletics. On a positive note the 8th grade students were slightly above the 80% return rate.
