E.	Other Recommendation and Comments: For the second year in a row it appears that Lincoln County High School is passing Test 1 and Test 3. For the second year in a row a potential RED FLAG area is present in regard to the overall spending differences with Boys and Girls. Although it has improved over last year
	it is still out of balance. Minutes of the Gender Equity Committee were not sent with the Annual Report to show that this potential RED FLAG area is being addressed by the Committee. It is mentioned in the Corrective Action Plan but a step by step Correction Action Plan is not indicated. You mentioned that you were spending more on girl's athletics this year but you did not note that spending was also up for boys athletics. The figures given in the 2010-2011

indicate that \$766.33 was spent per-male athlete while the 2009-2010 report showed the figure to be \$699.57. During that same time period the spending per-female athlete showed \$644.42 spent during the 2010-2011 period and \$483.67 per-female during the 2009-2010 period. The difference in spending per-male/female athlete is down from \$185.81 to \$121.91. When you are a football playing school these figures will never be equal but then the difference in spending is more that \$100.00 a potential RED FLAG goes up. We need for Lincoln County to send the minutes of the 2010-2011 Gender Equity Committee Minutes as well as your first meeting this year to the KHSAA by October 1, 2011. With this potential RED FLAG being an on going issue immediate attention needs to be given to the problem.

- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
 Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. E.		Other Recommendation and Comments: At this time it appears that Lincoln County High School is passing Test 1 and Test 3. Some concerns may come up in regard to the findings on your Student Interest Surveys. Only 80.5% of the surveys were returned and this is a low percentage of return. On the surveys returned there was a large student interest in Swimming and Wrestling. There is no indication in this report that the Gender Equity Committee has addressed this issue to see if that interest is real and genuine. Copies of the 2009-2010 Gender Equity Committee Minutes are to be forward to the KHSAA by September 1, 2010. Possible RED FLAG issues are apparent with the figures given on the T-35 and T-36 forms. The overall expenditures for Boys and Girls spending appears to be out of balance. With the figures

given in the report this year it showed that the overall boys spending was \$669.57 per male athlete and \$483.76 per female athlete for a difference of \$185.81. When you are a football playing school these figures will never be equal but when the difference in spending per male athlete compared to per female athlete is more that \$100.00 a potential RED FLAG goes up. There is nothing in the Corrective Action Plan to show that the Gender Equity Committee is aware of this potential situation and it is recommended that the committee meet and discuss this situation. Problems in overall spending can sometimes be found in looking at the differences in like sports and another potential RED FLAG may be developing with the differences in the spending in Equipment/Supplies when you look at Baseball/Softball.

With the figures reported by the school the following has occurred over the past three years . . .

- Boys Baseball has spent \$\$29,975.00 on Equipment/Supplies.
- Girls Softball has spent \$16,768,00 on Equipment/Supplies.
- That is a big difference of \$13,207.00 being spent on the Boys over a three year period.

There is no indication that the Gender Equity Committee is aware of this situation and nothing listed in the Corrective Action Plan that indicates that action is being taken to correct this potential RED FLAG situation.

There is concern that every sports team at Lincoln County received money for awards but the Boys and Girls Golf Team.
